Admission for specific courses is based on grade level, and in some cases, prior experience related to advanced courses.

Business Education: Keyboarding-Basic keyboarding skills and terminology and producing documents using Microsoft Office. Microsoft Office-Advanced courses using Word, Excel, Powerpoint, and Access. Accounting-Apply the procedures, principles, and methods of maintaining accurate business records. General Business-Increase understanding of business and skills related to being effective consumers. Business Law-Contracts, crimes, and torts related to business. Sports Marketing-Study basic elements of marketing.

Agriculture: Agri-Science-Apply scientific principles of plant, soil, and food science. Animal Science-Management and care of small and domestic animals. Wildlife/Natural Resources-Beginning skills and understandings related to conservation and natural resources. Small Engines-Beginning skills and understanding related to small engines. Building Design-Develop understanding of various elements of the construction process. Ag-Production-Skills and knowledge related to the Ag production industry. Ag-Management-Basic skills related to Ag business.

Industrial Technology: Wood/Drafting Technology-Design and construction of wood projects. Wood Technology-Design and construction of furniture projects. Drafting-Introduction to drafting. Hot and Cold Metals Technology-Basic tools and techniques to work with metals. Advanced Metal Technology-Advanced work with metals. Advanced Wood Technology-Design and construction of advanced projects. Architecture-All phases of designing a house.
